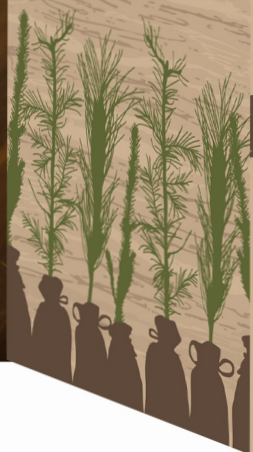

Seedling Display Instructions



Please unpack and display immediately upon receiving

SHELF LIFE: 2 weeks from receipt.

CARE: No special care for plants after display. Keep packages closed at all times and there is no need to water. It is best to have plants at a **consistent temperature**. **Avoid any sunlight** or areas that will become extremely warm due to the plastic sleeve.

Seedlings are packed in a baggie with small amount of moisture retaining paper mulch around the roots. This baggie will be closed with a twist tie.

The entire bagged seedling will be inserted into another plastic sleeve that will have a Full Color Picture of the species tree, Care & Handling instructions as well as Planting Instructions for the customer.



Though watering is NOT RECOMMENDED, if should you find the root area becoming too dry, you can add a small amount of water to the package. This can be accomplished by not opening the bag and using a small syringe to add water into the bag at the point where the bag is tied closed.

Do not add more than a couple ounces of water to the package.

This is a Bare Root Program designed to be sold quickly. Should you find that you need to extend shelf life, we recommend that the seedlings be transplanted into a pot with soil to maintain until sold.

CUSTOMER QUESTIONS:

When can I plant this outside? If the ground is not frozen, the plant can be put in the ground. The best place for any of these plants is in the ground!

What if I buy it now and it is too cold to plant outside? The plants will keep until weather is warm enough to plant outdoors. Keep plants in a cool place in the home. The Seedling will need to be transplanted into the ground or a pot...the selling package does not contain enough soil to maintain the tree for an extended period of time. Garages typically work fine.

After customer takes plant home, they can open the bag and plant if conditions allow. If conditions do not favor immediate planting, please follow the previous directions.
